# Looking Back: Year In Review

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

### PYP and MYP Exhibitions

The Junior School celebrated learning at the Grade 5 level with the Primary Years Programme Exhibition. All of our Grade 5's prepared a self-directed final project that shared their learning over a given topic with the school community. Their understanding, presentations and communication skills were on full display.

### (Re) Introduction to Honour Roll

The Senior School re-introduced the Honour Roll to our students, recognizing academic excellence at the mid-term and end of the year. We are proud of the 38 students who achieved this challenging academic standard.

### Math Competition Results

Students from the early grades through Grade 12 participated in various math competitions locally and nationally, including the prestigious Canadian Open Math Challenge where two of our students ranked in the top 25% and one student ranked in the top 10%. Aspengrove students consistently earned distinctions at every test they competed in.

### Graduation Results

We are proud of our graduates who were accepted to 23 universities combined, including some of the best programs in Canada. Our outstanding academic achievement is reflected in their International Baccalaureate results, averaging 34 compared to a global average of 30.5. Their total scholarship offers averaged \$16,500 per student.

## EXEMPLARY EXPERIENCES

### Senior School Co-Curriculars

The expansion of the Grade 8-12 co-curricular programs saw a dramatic increase in student involvement. This year, we grew to over 12 competitive athletic teams in volleyball, basketball, golf, mountain biking, skiing and snowboarding, rock climbing, ultimate frisbee, and track and field. These teams added to our existing complement of arts and leadership co-curriculars, which included offerings such as Model United Nations (MUN), e-sports, music, and arts.

### Middle School Teams and Activities

At the Middle School, all of our students represent Aspengrove in competitive soccer, volleyball, and basketball. Additional clubs challenged students in coding, band and various other games.

### Junior School Clubs and Activities

At the Junior School, over 85% of our students participated in a club. We also saw the introduction of student-led clubs including *Junior School's Got Talent!*

### Outdoor Education

Students from Grades 4 through 11 engaged in outdoor activities ranging from overnight stays in the Ravens Nest for Grades 4 and 5 to overnight hiking at Strathcona National Park.

## MILESTONES

This year we celebrated a number of firsts.

### Middle School Launch

The inaugural Middle School division, composed of Grades 6 and 7, was created to provide support for students specifically at this stage of life and learning. With core teachers who specialize in this age group and a mentorship program with the Senior School, the Middle School is able to bridge the gap between elementary and high school experiences in a challenging and supportive environment. We are happy to hear how well the Middle School was received by parents, teachers, and students.

### Arts Week

We were thrilled to introduce a week dedicated to celebrating and promoting creativity and innovation. Our students worked with guest artists, danced with professional performers, and concluded the week with an Evening of the Arts.

### Grandparents Day

In April, we welcomed over 100 VIPs – our grandparents – to campus! It was wonderful to welcome family members from as far away as Winnipeg to learn about Aspengrove and see their grandchildren in action!

### Senior School Evenings

Our student council organized several evenings for students to gather including the wildly successful Winter Formal, Halloween After-Party, and Board Game Cafe for Grade 8 to 12 students. These were wonderful ways to celebrate the seasons and have fun together.

## SIGNATURE EVENTS AND TRADITIONS

We are proud to be building traditions at Aspengrove. Throughout the year, these events brought our community and families together yet again.

### Ravens Rumble

The 2nd annual Ravens Rumble saw over 400 participants, including students, family members, friends, faculty, and staff engage in our obstacle course fun run and year-end picnic. The event also successfully raised over \$45,000 towards Science and Innovation initiatives at the school.

### Aspenghoul Spooktacular

Also returning for a 2nd year, the Spooktacular was scarier than ever! This Aspengrove Parents' Association event welcomed the community to our school and served up a chance to connect, collect candy, and try not to be scared.

### Aspengrove Day & Social

The second annual celebration of Aspengrove's history began with a recognition of the school's history. In the evening, parents came together at beautiful Superior Farms to connect and enjoy an art auction showcasing our students' incredible work, with proceeds supporting our arts program.

### Careers Day

In February, we welcomed four alumni back to campus to present on their respective career paths in law, medicine, nursing, and interior design. They shared their experiences, responded to student questions, and provided insight into the opportunities and challenges within their fields. Our students left inspired, energized, and with a broader sense of what's possible in their own futures.



# Graduation Spotlight: Pathway to Bright Futures

As a university preparation program, Aspengrove supports all students in determining and successfully obtaining entrance into the right program for them upon graduation. Students in Grades 11 and 12 work directly with our University Counsellor to identify the best university that will set them up for future success and ensure all necessary prerequisites are completed ahead of time for a successful application.

New this year, we introduced a Pathway Program to support earlier discussions about university and career planning. Beginning in grade 8, students meet with an advisor—and their parents—for guided conversations about future plans. These meetings provide opportunities for students to receive feedback, explore ideas, and make connections related to potential career areas that align with their passions and strengths. Starting these conversations early helps students gain a clearer sense of their goals and the paths they might pursue after graduation.

## ENROLLMENT TRENDS

The 2024-25 school year saw a significant increase in enrollment from 2023-24, growing to 292 students. As we begin the 2025-26 school year, enrollment continues to grow with a record high of 340 students. We are thrilled to welcome more students and families into our community and are happy to share that this growth in enrollment means Aspengrove can offer additional programs, electives, and overall vibrancy for our students.

A key factor in successful enrollment growth is maintaining a high retention rate among our existing families. Keeping current students and families at Aspengrove is vital, as they are the heart of our community – shaping our culture, upholding our high standards, and creating the connections that make our school so special. Retention is also a strong indicator of the impact our school has on students' experiences. We are proud to report that 2024-25 saw the highest retention rate in the past ten years!

## ADVANCEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

This past year, we proudly reintroduced the Annual Fund—an important way for our community to support initiatives that go beyond our daily high-quality education. It gives everyone a shared opportunity to support the school's most important priorities, and we are excited to continue this work in the 2025-26 academic year.

We are also pleased to share that over \$100,000 was raised last year through individual contributions, event support, and the Annual Fund. These gifts help advance the school, enabling the creation of new classes and clubs, enhancing student experiences in design, robotics, and technology, and improving our learning spaces.

## Campus Developments


Over the past year, Aspengrove School has made significant strides in revitalizing and enhancing our campus to better support learning, community, and student well-being. As part of our long-term vision to create a world-class educational environment, we have invested in purposeful improvements that enrich daily life for students and teachers alike and align with our mindset of achieving high.

A major highlight has been the revitalization of our Main Building, breathing new life into the heart of the campus. With upgraded finishes, improved functionality, and refreshed communal spaces, the Main Building now better reflects the vibrant and innovative spirit of our school. The Hive has become the central gathering point for our Senior School students and has created a sense of vibrancy and community.

Recognizing the importance of belonging and age-appropriate spaces, we started to create a dedicated Middle School hangout and play area—a place where students in Grades 6 and 7 can connect, relax, and enjoy unstructured time outdoors in a space designed just for them. Our commitment to excellence in teaching and learning has also been reflected in the enhancement of classroom environments across multiple grade levels. These upgrades support more flexible, student-centered learning and align with our evolving pedagogical goals.

Another exciting addition this year was the creation of the robotics lab and related components, marking the beginning of the expansion of our STEM offerings. This focus on hands-on learning encourages creativity and problem-solving, and with plans for a dedicated STEM space imminent, students will soon have even greater opportunities to explore technology, design, and the arts.

These facility improvements are not just upgrades, they are expressions of our commitment to create an inspiring, supportive, and future-focused learning environment for every student at Aspengrove.
